DEAN'S MESSAGE...

Happy Easter everyone. I know this has been a difficult year for ministers, musicians, and congregations to carry out worship services, due to the unprecedented obstacles put in their path due to the pandemic. However, my sincere hope is that we can all celebrate Easter with the joy it brings despite these unusual times.

Congratulations to our Editor, **Patti O'Connell**, who is this year's recipient of the **Helen Hosmer Award for Excellence in Music and Teaching**. The annual Hosmer award honors a graduate of the Crane School of Music at SUNY Potsdam. The presentation of the award will take place this July at the Reunion Weekend at Potsdam.

In the last issue of Mixtures, I was happy to announce Amanda Mole's recent appointment as organist and assistant music director at St Joseph's Cathedral in Columbus, Ohio. Jean suggested that I follow up with the other Young Artist Series guest organists as a "Where Are They Now" feature, highlighting one in each Mixtures issue. Dexter "Tripp" Kennedy was our guest in October 2014.

Tripp is a graduate of Oberlin (James David Christie) and Yale (Martin Jean). He gave a masterful performance at United Presbyterian Church on Friday night. He led an interesting workshop on Saturday morning on the subject of service improvisation, using as a guide, Jeffrey Brillhart's highly recommended workbook, *Breaking Free*. Two weeks after his Binghamton visit, he took first prize in the Chartres Competition (formally known as Grand Prix d'Interprétation at the 24th Concours International d'Orgue de Chartres) at Notre Dame Cathedral in Paris. (Below is the program that Tripp played in Binghamton, but for the most part was the same program he subsequently played in the competition.) While he

was here, Tripp got to meet with Jonathan Biggers, who gave Tripp some great advice on how to perform in competitions. Tripp later acknowledged that JB's advice was very helpful. As a result of his first-place award, Tripp was invited to perform in several European venues in the following year. He is represented by *Seven Eight Artist Management* and is a successful concert organist. (https://www.seveneightartists.com/) He holds the position of Assistant Director of Music of Christ Church Grosse Pointe (Michigan) where he serves as the principal organist for all choral services and concerts and directs the training of the novice boy and girl choristers. He is also on the faculty at Wooster College, Ohio, teaching harpsichord and organ.

As you are all aware, we have had to cancel our chapter events for the year due to the pandemic restrictions on group gathering. The chapter Executive Committee will be meeting soon to put together a list of events for the summer and fall in the hope and possibility that we will be able to resume our normal schedule of events. I am looking forward to when we can all get back together.
