CONCERT SNAPSHOT ...

Robert Oldroyd, Organist and Director of Music at First Presbyterian Church in Troy, PA, organized and led a concert for brass ensemble, organ and percussion on March 18 in celebration of the recent renovation and expansion of the 1945 Aeolian-Skinner organ done by Smith and Gilbert Organs. The program consisted of arrangements for the ensemble done by Oldroyd, highlighted by skillful arrangements of Grainger's Colonial Song, Handel's Largo from Xerxes and the Fdinale of Symphony #3 ("The Organ Symphony") by Saint-Saens. As part of the celebration, volunteers who assisted the Smith & Gilbert staff during the renovation, were introduced and honored by each being given a part of the organ that was taken out as a result of the renovation, with a brass plaque attached with the name of the volunteer. Paul has coordinated substantial new organ projects in Columbus, Ohio; Richmond, Virginia; and Hillsdale, Michigan. His keen sense of context, historical musical tradition, and successful large event planning has won him a substantial career within the National Church.

His Binghamton concert will feature music of Louis Vierne, Max Reger, Dietrich Buxtehude and others. He will explore all the colors and resources of the Trinity organ.
