

BCO NORDIC TREASURES...

The next concert of the Binghamton Community Orchestra is entitled "Nordic Treasures". It includes the concert overture Efterklange af Ossian by 19th century Danish composer, organist, and conductor Niels Gade, whose compositional style is often referred to as the Nordic Mendelssohn. Finnish composer Einojuhani Rautavaara's 1972 ode to the beauty of northern birds is captured in his Cantus Arcticus.
