I have just had a new collection of organ settings published by Lorenz, "MY LORD, WHAT A MORNING". Included are the title song (of course), There is a Balm in Gilead, Steal Away, etc. This would make a nice Christmas gift for an organ friend (or yourself), or is so very appropriate for use during Lent, which is early this year. I am using these settings as Preludes and Offertories, and have also used them as a Music Meditation during Lent with a narrator telling the story of each hymn. Publishers have been hurt so badly during Covid; I am thrilled to see that slowly we are coming back and so happy that this has finally been published.
