Along with Trinity Episcopal and Central Methodist, the Northminster organ is the third instrument that Smith & Gilbert has built in our area. Our congratulations and thanks to Tat, Tim, Rev. Rachel Helgeson, pastor of Northminster, and the Northminster congregation for bringing this new instrument to life.



We have decided to hold our members' recital on June 11 at Northminster, so all that want to perform in the

recital will get a chance to enjoy the new organ. I will be sending out an invitation soon for you to sign up to perform in the June recital. I can send the stop list for the organ to anyone who wants to perform.

## FROM JEAN, YOUR SUB-DEAN...


#### Organ Dedication at Groton Hill Music School, Groton, Massachusetts

*Our own* Richard Hedgebeth began the project before his untimely death in 2019... *our own* Dan Lemieux (META ORGANWORKS, N. Argyle NY) completed the project... *and our* friend and colleague, Randy Steere played a dedication recital on the spectacular 4-manual Hauptwerk Digital organ on Friday, April 14.

After a 1/2 hour lecture - demonstration explaining the wonders of the technology which went into the instrument, Randy *wowed* the audience with organ literature played on 4 of the 15 available organ sample sets: Walcker (Doesburg, Netherlands) - C. Schumann and Reger; Rosales (Portland, OR) - Fey and Bingham; Sonnenorgel (Goerlitz, Germany) - Bach; Cavaille-Coll (Caen, France) - Guilmant.

Projected on the large screen above the stage (behind which were the numerous banks of speakers) was the picture of the instrument whose sample set was being used. It was a joyous celebration of the organ and a meeting of organ lovers from the region NW of Boston...and one from Vestal!

## ORGAN CONSOLE DEDICATORY RECITAL...

Congratulations to our chapter member, John Jurgensen, who gave a breath taking organ re-dedication recital on April 16 at First United Methodist Church, Oneonta.

Along with works by Preston, Bach, Becker, Bédard, Mozart and Dupré, John gave a description of the work done (facilitated by Sidney Chase) with an accompanying slide presentation. The selected repertoire highlighted not only the magnificent new console but also the wide tonal expanse of the organ!
