#### DEAN'S MESSAGE ....

Since becoming Dean in June, the chapter board and I have been working hard on programming for the coming year. A few details remain to be worked out, but the overall plan is in place. I hope there will be something interesting, enjoyable, uplifting for everyone reading this. During this planning process two questions have been in my mind: 1 - how will this event (concert, DVD viewing, etc.) benefit current chapter members? And 2 - how will it help bring new people to appreciate the organ and its music?

Given the demographics of our membership, and of organists in North America, the second question may be more important, ultimately, than the first. The AGO has done good things at the national level about this, but I sense that more can and should be done locally and in our region. Of course, it doesn't help that church attendance has declined a lot from 50 years ago. But if we are willing to be creative and do some things we haven't done in a while, or ever before, the future can be bright.

Over the coming months, I challenge all of us, to think of ways which can increase awareness among the general populace, especially younger folks, of the organ, its music and its history.

For example, recent issues of TAO had articles about the Orgelkids project, and I've wondered if our chapter could do something with that and local schools, after school programs, or other groups. Our chapter has advertised in concert programs with other music organizations, but the audiences of those groups may be older than the age cohort we should be targeting. The other evening I had a half-dream of putting a small pipe organ (or cardboard model?) on the front lawn of my house, with recordings of dramatic music "piped" to the people on the sidewalk (there's an elementary school a block away, so lots of impressionable kids pass by). Probably not realistic or practical, but who knows what might come of such a thing?

You may remember that, in the last Mixtures, I initiated a "survey" to learn more about you, the members of our chapter, hoping that would help me (and the Board) meet your needs well. If you haven't responded to the survey yet, please do (see next page). Question D is a way to brainstorm how we can reach new, younger potential members. Wild and crazy ideas are welcome!
